

2023 Gender Justice Fellowship

Rutgers Center plans to sponsor up to two summer Gender Justice fellowships for students. Students based in Newark and Camden are encouraged to apply. The fellowship will provide \$4000 over the course of the summer. Students must find a job with a nonprofit organization focused on Gender Justice issues. The organization can be in NJ, NY, or PA. Expectations

The 2023 Gender Justice fellowship is designed to build a community among gender justice-minded students and to provide professional development opportunities and networks with the broader gender justice legal community. Accepted students will be expected to:

- students must find a job with a nonprofit organization focused on Gender Justice issues.
- Find an organization in NJ, NY, or PA
- accept offer and commit to working with the employer whose offer is being funded.
- Work full-time for at least 10 weeks at the funded employment site.
- adhere to the highest ethical and professional standards in representing themselves and Rutgers Law School.
- submit a 500-word description of the funded summer experience, as a form to be provided at the conclusion of the Summer.

Application Deadline: March 30, 2023

Application Process

All applications must include (in the order listed, with your name on each page – no zip files and no photos):

a) Resume

b) Official offer (or letterhead, or full copy of offer email) – must indicate that the position is unpaid

Application Information

c) Please briefly (in 200 words or less) describe why you believe the gender justice area you will be working in this summer is important, how it connects to your broader career goals, and if it may not be clear from the position, why you believe it should be considered “gender justice” work.

d) Please briefly (in 150 words or less) describe your financial situation, including how you would fund your living expenses this summer were you not granted a stipend (e.g., savings, loans, parental support, additional/paid job, etc.). If special circumstances reflect on your financial need (e.g., support of a child or parent, having worked substantial hours through law school, high debt load), please describe those circumstances.
